Speech & Language Pathologist Assistant Position

Job Summary:

The Speech and Language Pathologist Assistant works as part of a transdisciplinary team for children ages 5-22 years, with Autism Spectrum Disorder. The position responsibilities include: providing direct speech and language therapy services (individual, consult, and group) to assigned caseload of students (per their IEP's) under the supervision of licensed SLP, planning/scheduling of all individual and group sessions, creating individualized speech and language materials, working with students with an AAC device, and regularly collaborating with the team.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Possess an SLP-A license from the California Board of Behavioral Sciences
- Inspired by communication devices opening the possibilities to communicate knowledge, feelings, needs and wants
- Experience and training with Autism Spectrum Disorder or interest in the field of ASD
